

IMPACT REPORT

Because of alumni generosity, we have been able to fund several new projects at the Institute, including the Student Activity Center, Foundation Scholarship, School of Decision Sciences and Engineering, Entrepreneurship Center, IIT (BHU) Main Library, the Student Academic Center, and the Advanced Vibration Lab.

1. Nikesh Arora (1989, EEE), in conjunction with Palo Alto Networks, donated a total of \$2M to establish the Access Fund, a needs-based scholarship for students preparing for technological careers. His donation has enabled full ride scholarships for 21 students in the 2021-2022 session, 22 students in the 2022-2023 session, and 34 students in the 2023-2024 session to attend IIT (BHU) for a total of 77 scholarship recipients as of 2024.

The Foundation maintained its fiduciary responsibility to ensure that investment returns would be sufficient to support these students for four years covering fees and medical insurance. We believe that it is important to encourage more women in STEM, especially those who are economically disadvantaged.
